In November I had begun to think about the month of December and how I had always envisioned what a proper Christmas was like. But for various reasons it had never turned out the way I had imagined, either because of lack of support in my life or the feeling of being alone.

At our November OCF dinner we only had one family, a couple of brothers from Exterran, along with my wife and a good friend. We discussed the idea of putting on a Dinner with Prime Rib and presents for children in the community whose parents were having a difficult time getting on their feet because of our present economy. Everyone was enthused with the idea, so I began to pursue putting it together. From the very beginning it was a complete walk of faith, because I was told that there wasn't enough time, and we needed more planning.

In the Beginning I intended on selling tickets which would sponsor the families, and cover most of the costs; \$15. When I made contact with Quality Meats where I intended on purchasing the Prime Rib, I found that the ticket sales would barely cover about a ¼ of the cost.

At this point I became more determined and thought of three people who had told me at one time that if we ever needed anything for the OCF, they would pony up the money. I called all three and initially only one responded with, "I'll take care of all the meat." I chuckled to myself, because I had not told him how much it was going to be! We were talking about \$1200.

When he and I finally talked about the money he said, "What do you need, \$2500, \$3000?" What a confirmation that God wanted this to happen!

Then we began to search for families who had no way of having the money to have a proper Christmas. In the process we got to know Sue Tuffin with the Workforce Center here who was more than happy to provide us with Families in need! 'Overjoyed' is a better word. I asked Sue to make a request of each of the Parents to get a small list from their children of what they would like for Christmas.

It was here that some of the folks who had volunteered to be a part of putting this together dropped out of sight and I must say that I began to question God myself. The thirty day time frame seemed out of the question and then one of the three people whom I called about the meat said he would donate \$500 toward the gifts and for the remainder of the menu items! And then the third friend gave another \$200! All three (wise men) wanting to remain anonymous.

— Is it because of you, me or 'them'?



Things are indeed changing each year and some things not for the better. More conscious of this at Christmas, I can't help but use December each year as a benchmark as to how far we have gone backwards as a Christian nation. This is the season when I most reflect about the cultural changes in our country that are contrary to our Christian beliefs and I wonder why this seems to be happening at a faster pace than ever.

What do I mean by this?

The obvious one is that we see more objections to the celebration of Christ birth than we did the year before. You and I as Christians plainly see this and all can give numerous examples. One that really intrigues me and of course saddens me are the blatant ways in which more companies try to be politically correct in naming their, dare I say it, Christmas parties.

For example a friend of mine who lives in a state often beset with terrible snow and ice storms told me that a business in his city was calling their company Christmas party a Winter Party! His comment was that he was not only offended by this foolishly named event but said, "Besides, I'm sick of cold and who the heck wants to celebrate winter with a party?!"

Pardon the pun, but this is just

the tip of the iceberg of politically correct Christmas party names that are conjured up every year. The sad thing is that when all this began years ago someone at that first meeting surely must have asked, "What if we offend the Christians who work here?" So the question to us is "How do we reverse the course of our nation, better yet the world and I submit, "Sharing the good news of Christ with one person at a time."

6. Do you have a plan for growth?
7. Are you following your plan?
8. Are your spiritual authorities a way of and involved in your growth?
9. Does the Word of God govern your life habits?
10. Are you becoming more Christ-like in your thoughts, attitudes and behaviors?

The Significance of 'A Leg O Lamb'

"Just as the shepherd snatches from the lion's mouth a couple of legs or a piece of an ear, so will the sons of Israel dwelling in Samaria be snatched away..." — Amos 3:12

Good morning! Among the duties of shepherds in biblical days was guarding their flocks from wild animals. A lion (or other beast) could take a sheep or lamb in an instant without the protection of a shepherd.

A shepherd's nightmare was for one of the flock to be taken, especially if it was due to his neglect or lack of effort when the threat was posed. Even a hired hand or slave dreaded the prospect of reporting a lost lamb to his master. It was not uncommon, then, for a shepherd to literally engage in battle with a lion to save the life of a lamb or sheep under attack. The obscure passage in Amos above reminds us that in spite of his best efforts, if a shepherd was unable to save the unfortunate lamb, he would often fight to take a leg or an ear away from the lion to show his master that he had mounted a valiant effort to save the animal. The leg or piece of ear was proof, of sorts, that the shepherd had fought the wild beast with all his might and refused to give up without risking even his own life.

How quickly are you willing to accept defeat at work? When you are challenged, threatened or attacked do you give up easily or put up a truly valiant effort to save the situation, deal, contract, relationship, etc.? Oftentimes the slim difference between a narrow workplace victory and a defeating loss is simply one's refusal to quit. In the part of the country where I live, say the name Jimmy V and most people quickly recall the late Coach Jim Valvano (N.C. State Wolfpack head basketball coach and NCAA Champions, 1983) and his incredibly brave battle against cancer. It is easy to remember the passion with which he laced his signature quote: "Don't give up! Don't ever give up!" It was his trademark on and off the court.

Today's Workplace Challenge: Acknowledge that everyone is going to face obstacles (sometimes of major proportions) at work. They will often be threatening to the health and well-being of the company, employees, some aspect of daily operations, or you personally. Refuse to give in to the threat or challenge! Resolve to hang in there with the help of God! Ask Him for guidance and instruction. Huddle with your team or office mates this morning, if needed, and refine your strategy. Discuss those issues that are currently "attacking" your business or workplace; resolve as a team to dig deeper. Develop new methodologies as needed. Ask the Lord to pour out a spirit of refreshment and renewal on you if you have grown weary in the battle. Press on today! You may be about to conquer the "animal" that has recently threatened you. Most likely, with God's help the situation will be handled and overcome. If it isn't, don't let it be so because you gave up without a fight. Let Christ take you through this process. You are going to win the war; that has already been promised if you are a believer. But should you lose this battle, so to speak, don't walk away without a leg or an ear to show that you gave it all you had! Do all you can today and leave the results to your Mighty God. Have a wonderful Monday and make it count at work! *"Don't be afraid, for I am with you. don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand."* Isaiah 41:10

Christmas Stays! SBOE Votes to Keep Christmas in Social Studies

Dear Kathy ,

Thank you for speaking out by signing our petition to keep Christmas in social studies standards! See below for our media statement on the State Board of Education's vote late last night. Last night's vote is the first taken by the SBOE, and a final vote will take place in March, which should have the same result.

MEDIA STATEMENT:

The Texas State Board of Education (SBOE) voted late last night to keep Christmas and other important historical figures in social studies standards, effective for the next ten years. Free Market Foundation, which led the charge to put Christmas back in the standards after it was removed, issued the following statement:

"Censoring the religious background of our heritage as Texans and Americans is not good education and is unacceptable," said Kelly Shackelford, President/CEO of Free Market Foundation. "We are grateful the Board represented Texans well and ensured this attempt to rewrite history was crushed."

Nearly 5,300 Texans signed the Free Market Foundation petition at www.ChristmasTextbooks.com to keep Christmas in social studies standards launched just a few weeks ago.

"Christmas should have never been removed from social studies, while Ramadan and other holidays remained," said Jonathan Saenz, Legislative Director at Free Market Foundation. "The Board heard the message of over 5,200 Texans loud and clear: You don't mess with Christmas in Texas."

Holidays now included in sixth grade social studies include Christmas, Easter, Ramadan, Yom Kippur, Rosh Hashanah, Vaisakhi, Diwali, and the annual hajj. The SBOE also kept in the phrase "describe how religion (and virtue) contributed to the growth of representative government..." This phrase had been removed by an unelected curriculum review team earlier. Columbus is now back in the social studies more often than Mary Kay Ash. The curriculum review team had eliminated Columbus in a particular section, but the SBOE corrected this bizarre imbalance.

This is the first vote by the SBOE. The final version of social studies curriculum and final votes will not come until March of this year. FMF will continue watching this issue closely through March and we will present updated signature results for our Christmas Petition , so encourage others to sign on! The standards, once approved, will go into effect in 2011 and remain in place for ten years.

I look forward to serving with you.

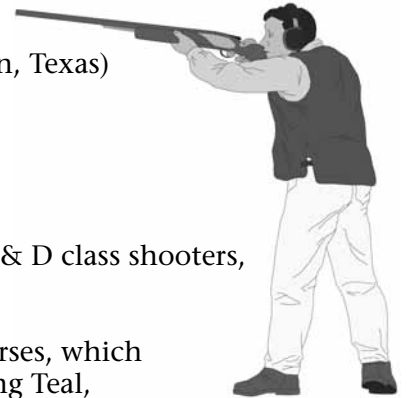

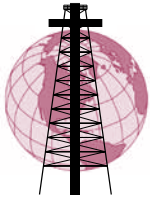
