What's In a Name?

— *I wonder sometimes* (an update)

Sometimes I can't go past a church without noticing its name or slogan on the marquee and the same can be said when reading the religious section of the newspaper.

What I see makes me wonder how God must feel about the jillions of church names and denominations that man has come up with over the ages; each in essence proclaiming they are different from the others. Most believe in the same Bible and declare the same Jesus yet have developed their own comfortable theology. The late comedian Flip Wilson playing the part of the 'Rev' on his popular television show, called his satirical church, "The Church of What's Hapnin' Now", which resonates with some of the actual names.

Now before you get all torqued up theologically with me, if I happen to mention your church's name, cut me a little slack and lighten up for just a few laughs and thought.

Logically, if an uninformed stranger were to see the name, Smithville Full Gospel Church over the church door, might he not ask himself? "Is there a Smithville Half-Full Gospel Church somewhere or even a three quarter Gospel Church?"

If there is a First Baptist Church and a Second Baptist Church, then mustn't there be a third and fourth Baptist Church? If a Second Baptist Church becomes larger than a First Baptist does the Second become the First? And is a 'Greater' First Baptist Church better than the First and Second Baptist Churches?

A Canadian friend Kerry told me about a church in his town that had to change its name after forty years because they couldn't handle the growing number of phone inquiries from the areas growing population of East Indians. Its old name; Edmonton Gospel 'Temple'

Does the name 'United' Methodist infer that there are other Methodist who aren't united? Why are there 'First' United Methodists but no 'Second' United Methodists, nor Second Church of Gods, Second Churches of Christs or Second Christian Churches? But get this! I did find a Fourth Church of Christ listed!

Why does one church call itself the Church of God, another the Church of Christ and yet another, the Holy Spirit

And the ads for the various churches in this past Saturdays paper... "Exciting Preaching for Better Living"? Will someone please explain this one to me? How can exciting preaching change ones life? I thought only Christ does this.

And this one; "Find the Champion in you." Isn't being a child of God adequate? And my own church, "Exciting Second"? I love my church and I'm excited to be there, but some mornings as I look around, some aren't!

The Oilfield Missionary

Tragedy struck. A major oil company's Business Manager in a Central American country was not just murdered, but was killed execution style. Someone from the Houston office had to go to visit with the family and to keep the business going forward. Gregg Eaton was selected to go.

Gregg is also a Christian who attends Humble First Assembly of God. One of the first things he thought of as he planned his trip was the missionaries living there and what needs they might have. Gregg contacted each of them and asked them for a list of things he could bring when he made the trip. One missionary asked for a large mixer to make cookies for the Teen Challenge group they are in charge of. Another asked for beef jerky and chocolates, one missionary family asked for two bottles of aspirin and another single missionary asked for bite size shredded wheat without frosting. Gregg then contacted the Pastor at Humble First Assembly who pledged his church's help in purchasing these items.

He called the missionaries and asked them to meet him at the hotel where he could buy their dinner and give them the gifts. He packed the items in a suitcase and headed south. Unfortunately, when he landed in country, the bag with the gifts was missing. Sadly, Gregg went to his hotel without the suitcase. Once there, he called his wife and told her the bad news. She prayed with Gregg and spread the news to other praying people to ask for God's intervention in finding the suitcase.

The first miracle occurred three days later. The suitcase was found at the airport. Gregg went to get his luggage. When he got there, customs agents wanted three hundred to five hundred dollars to allow him to leave with the suitcase. However, he was finally allowed to leave with the suitcase without paying the bribe or even being asked what was inside the suitcase. He then went about the task of delivering the presents.

The mixer and the jerky were delivered at one meeting. The second miracle occurred when the missionary family who asked for two bottles of aspirin arrived the following day at the hotel to meet Gregg. For reasons that Gregg explains as the "still small voice of God", he had held back one bag of jerky originally purchased for the first missionary family, to give to this family. Unbeknownst to Gregg, the teenage daughter had told her mother to call

Gregg back and ask him for jerky after she had hung up the phone, having only asked for aspirin. She told her daughter, "No, I can't ask him for that, if you want jerky, you will just have to pray for it." And pray she did! Gregg says, "Right there in the hotel lobby I thought we were going to have church as I pulled out two bottles of aspirin and a one pound bag of beef jerky." The missionaries' teenage daughter said, "Oh momma, I know now that God hears my prayers and loves me."

This seemingly small act of kindness by Gregg, to put God's kingdom first, even in his working world, will leave a mark on this missionary family they will never forget. It also shows all of us the importance of listening and looking to God in all we do. Jesus said in Mathew 6:33 when he was summing up the impact of putting our faith in God concerning our needs and provisions; "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."

There are so many lessons to be learned by this example of living a Christ centered life. First, Gregg is asked to go out of the country where a co-worker has been executed. Instead of praying for God to release him of this duty, he asks what he could do to further the kingdom of God. He replaced fear with faith. Secondly, when adversity struck at airport customs he didn't cave into an expensive quick fix. He called on the help of other Christians to pray for God's help. He took a stand on rock of God's promises of provision. Thirdly, he was obedient to the Holy Spirit's urging to supply a bag of jerky for a girl he didn't know wanted it, but God did and wanted to reward her faithfulness and show her the kind of God she and her family served. There are no coincidences in the service of the Lord. He is in control.

One thing we all in the OCF can take away from this example is to remember Romans 12:9-13, "9 Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. 10 Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; 11 not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; 12 rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; 13 distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. When you travel overseas or are otherwise able to help those in other countries to spread the gospel message remember the OCF can help with a supply of Bibles, tracts or teaching books.

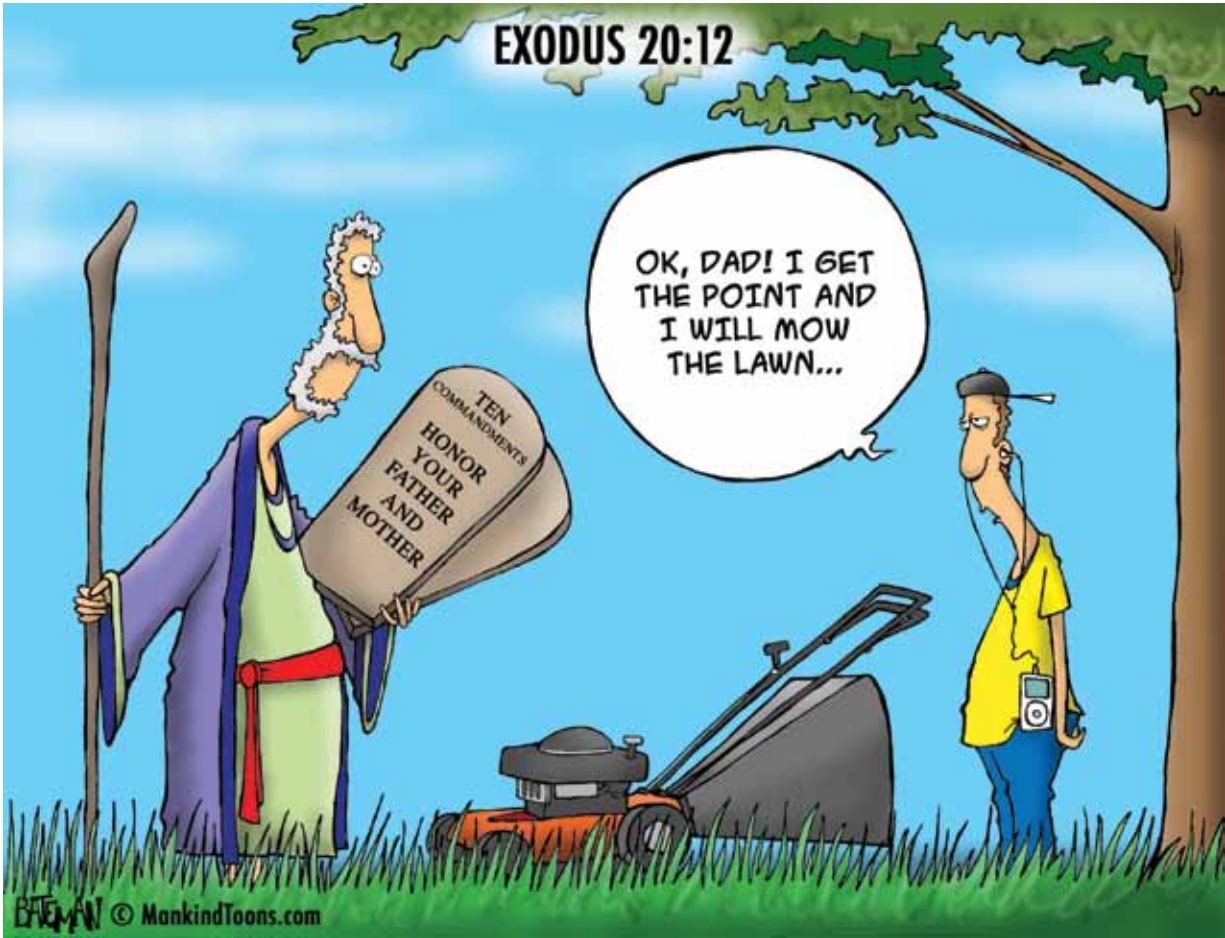

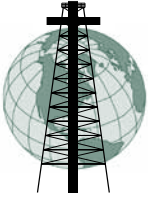
