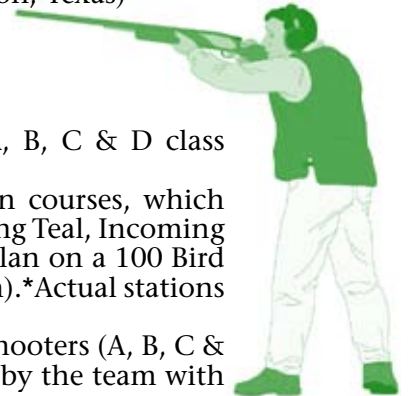
Trophies for top shooting teams for A, B, C & D class shooters, Lewis Class Scoring

"Solving Fraud. . ." — And Oil Patch Unemployment



After reading a story on the front page of the local newspaper, *Feds Strike at Medicare Fraud Here*, I immediately thought about how the oil industry could solve this fraud problem and the layoffs at the same time.

Among the many examples cited in this article was one of an area doctor/couple who defrauded the government out of millions of dollars by submitting false Medicare claims never performed, and dispensing illegal controlled substances. Another local doctor has bilked the Fed out of 30 million dollars in just two years; allegedly seeing an average of 160 patients a day! And these were obviously just the tip of the proverbial iceberg nationwide as a new federal task force call HEAT found 285 million dollars worth of false claims in just one week!

How many years have we had Medicare, (1965), and when was this 'cutting edged' task force formed? (2007) I would guess their late start might have something to do with... **POLITICS!!**

The fraud nationwide is staggering with everything from over payments for scooter sales in Miami, (A savings of \$334 million after arrests.), to dispensing pain killers to addicts every two weeks beside a water cooler in one tiny so-called 'clinic'. In the home of one doctor was found 1.5 million in cash, most of it in small envelopes filled with twenties, a normal way for drug addicts to pay their drug pusher. The doctor said it was "petty cash". After he had cheated the government/us, out of several million dollars, I guess relatively speaking it was indeed, petty cash to him.

When you sum it all up, according to John Cornyn, R-Texas, 60 billion dollars were fraudulently paid out by (we tax payers) via Medicare 'oversight' bureaucrats last year alone. (Ironically while I was writing this article, I received a notice from the IRS that I

owe an extra \$145 on my 2008 return!) Talk about 'stepping over dollars to save pennies'!

Experts now predict that Medicare will be broke in as little as eight years. Frankly it breaks my heart to think of all the good that 60 Billion could have done us all but now it's just a memory. The sad thing is that it continues at this hour and will until it does go broke. Another sad note is what the lawyer for one of the doctors said, and he is probably right, "**The government cannot prove the allegations.**"

Please Mr. President, let the oil patch help us out!

I submit this to congress. Let our unemployed people in the oil industry go to Washington and straighten this mess out!

First let the service company owners, mostly small businesses, look after the profit and losses each day at the Fed. After all, small businesses in the United States are responsible for 7 out of ten jobs created. They have earned the right to apply their expertise to help fix what 435 congressmen seemingly cannot do.

Then let the oil operators take care many of the details. They will consistently be looking at the best prices from all aspects in relation to their ability to produce goods at a fair price and return for their investors and the end user. Dailey rig costs are

submitted and talked about every day between the company men on location to the engineers in the offices, so there is always scrutiny about what is being spent against the planned cost. This process is practical, reasonable, proven to be successful and needs to be duplicated in Washington ASAP!

And don't forget the rig crews in this equation. We've all heard term 'grass roots' and I can't think of a better grass roots coalition to represent the working man than a rig crew headed up by a good first sergeant, the tool pusher. They as well have to keep up with the daily drilling costs. Talk about your checks and balances! Between the engineers and the rig personnel, they'd discover any Medicare or otherwise fraud within minutes of it happening!

Here are some differences between the oil patch and congress illustrating why I believe we can get this disaster straightened out.

- When we mess up in the oil patch, we get 'run off'; **the politician just lays low until election.**

- We prove ourselves and work our way up; **they get their jobs with money, personality and untold promises.**

- We work to make a living; **they work to become well off.**

- While we're going to blow-out school; **they are going to bail-out school.**

- We are required to pass Company ethics courses; **they chance to be unethical.**

- Geologists tell us where to drill; **they say no you can't.**

- We ask value for our bucks; **they say give us your bucks.**

- We are motivated; **they oft castigated.**

- We 'turn it to the right'; **they, wherever the wind blows.**

And last but most important; we work an average of 49 weeks out of the year, always getting the job done right and on time; they have long recesses.

- A week in February for President's Day, a week in mid-March, a two week Easter/April recess, one week for Memorial Day, a five week recess beginning the 1st of August, a one - week recess for the 4th of July, one week for Thanksgiving, and one week in early October for no apparent reason at all! (Thirteen weeks; almost as much time as a French citizen has off each year!)

Well, it also happens to be God's business—and He has set in motion a law stating: "You shall not steal." When you break God's law, it breaks you! For God's laws are living, active things—like the law of gravity. When you transgress them, the punishment is automatic—and it is sure."

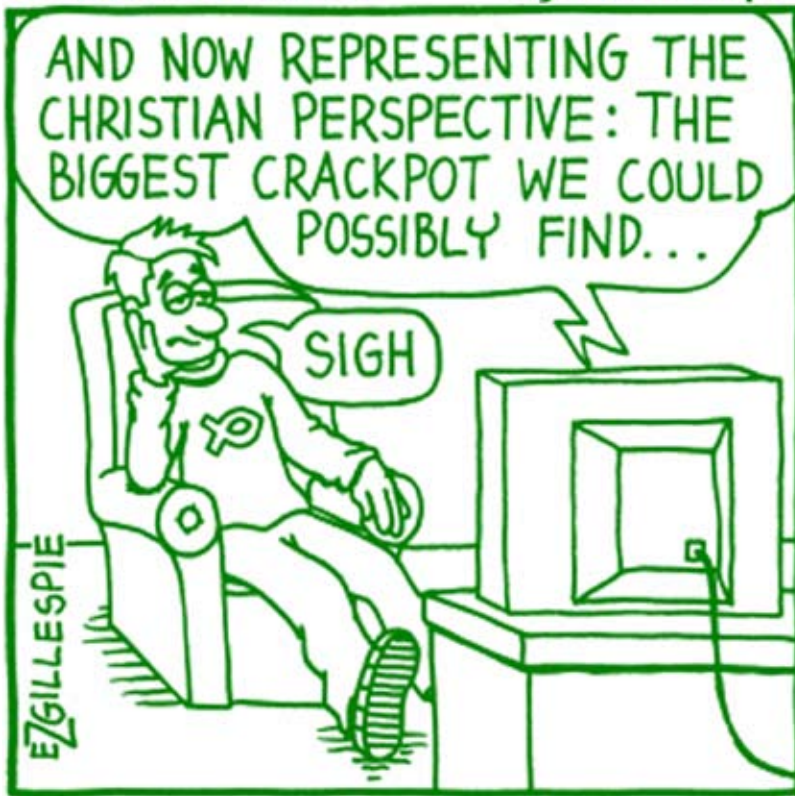

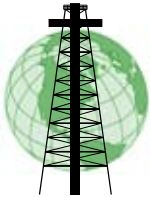
